

OCTOBER 2, 2012

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Runnemede was held on the above date in the meeting room of the Borough Hall, 24 N. Black Horse Pike, Runnemede, NJ. The meeting was called to order at 5:32 PM. The following members were present at roll call: Mayor Kalvaitis, Council members: Kappatos, Passio, White & Beatrice. Absent: Kisielewski & Williams. Present: CFO/Business Administrator, Richard Wright, Borough Engineer, Mark Basehore, Jack Kennedy, Solicitor.

STATEMENT: Mayor Kalvaitis read the notice of this meeting pursuant to the "Open Public Meetings Act."

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion was made by Beatrice, seconded by Kappatos that the minutes of the 9/4/12 meeting be approved as submitted by the clerk. The motion carried and Mayor Kalvaitis declared the minutes approved.

REPORT OF CONSTRUCTION CODE OFFICIAL: A report was read stating that the sum of \$9,276.00 was collected in various building permits and license fees during the month of September, 2012. All fees were turned over to the Borough Treasurer.

REPORT OF BOROUGH TREASURER: A report was read indicating deposits on account as of 9/30/12 totaling \$5,082,840.91.

REPORT OF BOROUGH CLERK: A report was read reporting that the sum of \$600.00 was collected for various permits and licenses together with \$174.00 in pet licensing fees during the month of September, 2012. All fees were turned over to the Borough Treasurer.

ORDINANCE #12-11

SPECIAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, it has been found necessary to make an Emergency Appropriation to meet certain extraordinary expenses incurred, or to be incurred, by the need for revision of property assessments; and

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WHEREAS, N.J.S. 40 A4-53 et al provides that it shall be lawful to make such appropriation, which appropriation and/or the "special emergency notes" issued to finance the same shall be provided for in succeeding annual budgets by the inclusion of an appropriation of at least one-fifth or one-third of the amount authorized pursuant to this act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the governing body of the Borough of Runnemede, County of Camden that in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S. 40A:4-55:

1. An emergency appropriation be and the same is hereby made for the preparation and execution of property assessments in the total amount of \$120,000.00; and

2. That said emergency appropriation shall be provided for in full in the budgets of the next succeeding years by the inclusion of not less than \$24,000.00 in each of the next succeeding annual budgets.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to such inconsistencies; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, all ordinances or parts of ordinances not inconsistent with this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance will take effect after adoption and publication according to law.

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALARIES OF THE
EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE,
COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The annual salaries of the Borough Employees shall be respectfully as follows:

ASSESSOR 10,000 to 42,000

SEWER SUPERINTENDENT 30,000 to 75,000

SECTION 2: The salaries as specified in Section 1 hereof shall be effective as of January 1, 2012 and shall continue in effect until amendment of this ordinance.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same are hereby repealed but to the extent of such inconsistency only.

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE POSITION OF
PART-TIME SUPERVISING EMT IN THE
BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE, COUNTY OF CAMDEN,
STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Runnemedede, County of Camden, State of New Jersey feel there is a need to establish a position of part-time supervising EMT in the borough; and

WHEREAS, Mayor and Council wish to create the position of part-time supervising EMT with a fixed salary and no other benefits; and

WHEREAS, the part-time supervising EMT shall be responsible for all duties and functions as outlined in the NJ Civil Service Commission job classification under the direction of the Deputy Fire Chief/Emergency Services Coordinator

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Runnemedede, County of Camden and State of New Jersey, that the position of supervising EMT be and hereby is established with the duties and functions stated herein and such other responsibilities as provided by law or determined by the governing body, and that such part-time supervising EMT shall be paid a fixed salary with no other benefits.

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attached hereto for the services required for the needs of the County of Camden and other Cooperative Purchasing Members; and

WHEREAS the term of agreement shall commence on or about September 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014 with the pricing as indicated on the schedule below, with a single one-year option to renew at the sole discretion of the County; and

WHEREAS, Camden County Energy Recovery Associates, LP has extended pricing to both Camden County and to the members of the Camden County Cooperative Pricing System as set forth in the bid specifications; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Runnemede is a participant in the Camden County Cooperative Pricing System and this bid; and





ORDINANCE #12-09

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COMPLETION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AT BEAVER BRANCH PARK IN THE BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$150,000 THEREFOR; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OR OTHER DEBT OBLIGATIONS OF THE BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$142,500; MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND COVENANTS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Runnemede, County of Camden, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

Section 1. The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Runnemede, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Borough").

Section 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the Borough from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$150,000;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds, bond anticipation notes or other debt obligations to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$142,500; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$7,500 for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11*.

Section 3. The sum of \$142,500, to be raised by the issuance of bonds, bond anticipation notes or other debt obligations, together with the sum of \$7,500, which amount represents the required down payment, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").

Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds or other debt obligations of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$142,500 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds or other debt obligations shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.

Section 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$142,500 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting,

PROCLAMATION

October 10, 2012, has been declared Put The Brakes On Fatalities Day® by the
BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE;

- WHEREAS, Across the nation, traffic crashes caused 32,310 fatalities in 2011, and are the leading cause of death for young people ages 15 to 34; and,
- WHEREAS, In New Jersey, 627 individuals lost their lives in traffic crashes in 2011; and,
- WHEREAS, Alcohol-related crashes accounted for 24 percent of the State's traffic fatalities, while speed related fatalities for 2011 climbed to 174 from 61 recorded in 2007.
- WHEREAS, Motorcyclists, bicycle riders and pedestrians face increased risks on New Jersey's roadways, as people opt for alternative modes of transportation; and,
- WHEREAS, 92 motorcyclists, 17 bicyclists and 143 pedestrians were killed in New Jersey in traffic-related crashes in 2011; and,
